RULES CORNER. The last few times my ball has landed very close to the large boulder that sits in the ground on Hole #17, to the right of the 150 marker in the fairway, I have wondered what the ruling would be if the ball landed on the rock. I have heard both that it's a free lift and the other being that you play it as it lies and to proceed under Rule 19 as unplayable. So, I decided to inquire what the correct ruling by asking the USGA Rules Team. Their answer is as follows: Since the boulder is a Natural immovable object (vs an artificial or man-made immovable object) you either have the option to play the ball as it lies or declare it as unplayable. If you choose to declare it unplayable, you will incur a one stroke penalty and must proceed according to Rule 19 (unplayable ball). Since your course has not declared the boulder an immovable obstruction, you are not entitled to free relief under Rule 16.1. So folks, if your ball does land on a rock, you cannot take free relief. I believe this is

similar to having your ball land on tree roots, another Natural immovable object. Also please note that in order to declare the boulder as an immovable obstruction you must adopt a Local Rule to that effect.
